Working with Files

[?] How do we perform simple operations like viewing a list of files?

- `ls`
 - `-l` List view
 - `-a` Display all files, including hidden
 - `-h` Display human friendly file sizes

Color	Description
Default color	Normal/text file
Blue	Directory
Sky blue	Symbolic link or audio file
Green	Executable file
Yellow on Black	Device
Pink	Image file
Red	Archive file
Red on Black	Broken link

[?] How do we view the contents of a file?

- `cat`
 - Displays file contents to stdout
 - Not paginated
 - `sudo cat /var/log/messages`
- `more`
 - Same as cat, but paginated
- `less`
 - Same as more, but allows bidirectional scrolling

[?] What if we only want to see the top or bottom of the file?

- `head`
 - Displays first 10 lines
 - `sudo head /var/log/messages`
 - `sudo head -n 5 /var/log/messages`
- `tail`
 - Displays last 10 lines
 - `sudo tail /var/log/messages`
 - `sudo tail -n 5 /var/log/messages`
 - `sudo tail -f /var/log/messages`

[?] How would we go about moving a file to a different location?

- `touch`
- `cp`

- `cp -R ~/myfiles /opt/myfiles`
- `mv`
 - `mv ~/file1 /opt/mylist`
- `rm`
 - `rm -R ~/myfiles`

[?] Are directories handled the same way as files?

- `mkdir`
- `rmdir`
